

Dear U. C. C., Congregational Members and Friends,

One of the things I liked a lot about the original Santa Clause film (1994) is that intentionally or not it went a long way in putting back into Christmas the magic Christmas formerly had before common sense made us 'get real' about Santa Claus and his mythical travels. It was a stroke of genius to enable Santa to dematerialize, rematerialize and become an integral part of another person's identity. The first Santa Clause film is a happy trip into and out of fantasy and magic land. I like watching it each Christmas season. It has become just as much a part of my Christmas tradition as The Night Before Christmas poem and The Nativity Stories are. They all are a part of reality at the same time as they all are very much beyond it.

At the same time I am very much aware that for a person of faith, everything else pales in comparison with The Nativity Stories, even as miraculous as every child's birth is. The stories celebrate a special aspect of Jesus' nature some say was undoubtedly present at his birth, but didn't become evident until his adult years to his followers, especially in their post-humus reflections. The Nativity Stories were composed to highlight that special aspect by using the natural and mythical world to celebrate it. When looking back at what he said and did 'way back then,' we see how timeless and relevant his perspective is still today. We aspire to embrace what he valued as the standard for what we value.

All this said, there is no other time of the year when positive regard abounds more than at this time of the year. The fact that it does, even in the midst of any naysaying to the contrary, highlights the potential in us to be more the people Jesus believed people could be 'way back then,' and people can be still today.

I hope our experience this holiday season includes time for warm reflections, opportunities for laughter, occasions to enjoy others and others to enjoy us, and time for sharing those intangible gifts we each have been given.

We appreciate any and all donations! If you're interested in helping with this great project, please let me know!






Thursday, Dec. 14 7:00 pm Jane Vavrick's – 1237 Bucks Run, Webster


